Twenty-eight Western Australian schools sent their best and brightest students to the 2014 Hale School Philosothon. These events encourage students to participate in 'Communities of Inquiry', investigating deep philosophical and ethical questions with rigour and clarity. In preparing and participating in the event students have the opportunity to practice and develop higher order thinking and communication skills.

While the Philosothon involves competition, it is not a debate. It honours the Socratic spirit of philosophy with its commitment to collaborative inquiry. In their sessions together, students had the opportunity to explore a range of philosophical questions by thinking together in ways that are both critical and creative and at the same time cooperative and caring.

At the end of the evening a magnificent trophy was awarded to the winning school, Scotch College and medals were awarded to various categories. All students received a certificate and a badge in honour of their selection to represent their school.

The past week the students have been engaged in End of Year Activities which has provided them with opportunities to finish the year off successfully. You will have the opportunity to meet with all of your subject teachers and finish at 3:00pm.

All Year 8-10 students **new** to Gold Creek Senior Campus in 2015 that have not yet finalised their enrolment can do so by reporting to the Library on **Monday, 2 February 2015** from 9:30am. Please ensure appropriate documentation (birth certificate, immunisation records, proof of address and most recent school report) is brought along.
