At Gold Creek we embed a wealth of assessment strategies, both formal and informal so that we can plan and assess student learning and support teachers in professional development. It is often during the impromptu conversations and group discussions that we learn more about students understanding, and we endeavour to capture this evidence of learning as assessment too!

Kim has had significant impact both on her students and the school, and we wish her all the best in her new position. 



## Year 6 News

Last term our Unit of Inquiry was 'Who We Are' and we explored how 'Culture may impact on beliefs, values and actions'. We began our inquiry by looking at how people's past may have shaped who they are today. We also looked at bedrooms from around the world to see what we could learn about their owner's culture. We then focused on ourselves; we brainstormed 'What it means to be human' and what that means for us. We used the brainstorm to analyse our own beliefs and values and how they shape our actions. ## Gold Creek School's 2015 Commemorative Cross Project Arrives in France

In 2015, as a part of the '100 Years of ANZAC Commemorations' the Year 5 and 6 classes joined the Australian War Memorial's Commemorative Crosses project, led by our then DSTA/DTM Hilary Kinraid and teacher Anna Buckman. In short, all the students were provided with a small wooden cross each and encouraged to write a reflective message. Many thought provoking messages were written acknowledging the risks and sacrifice that had been made to ensure Australia remains a safe place to live. On the back of the cross the students wrote their name and school. These crosses have now been taken overseas and placed on the war graves of Australian servicemen and woman who have lost their lives while on active service.

This week Gold Creek School received a lovely email from a couple who attended this year's Dawn Service on Anzac Day in Villers-Bretonneux, France. On leaving the Memorial they were asked to place a cross on a soldier's grave. It had the name of a student from Gold Creek School. This student is now attending another school but we have shared the email with her family who advise the student "was incredibly proud to see her cross".

## ENROLMENTS FOR 2019 ARE NOW OPEN

**We would just like to confirm enrolment procedures for current Gold Creek students in Preschool and Year 6.**

Current students in a Gold Creek School Preschool **do not** need to reapply to attend Gold Creek Kindergarten in 2019 unless their current enrolment for preschool was accepted on a **'one year only basis.'** Families who have received this letter will need to complete an enrolment form to continue in an ACT public school.

Current Year 6 students at Gold Creek School **do not need** to complete a new enrolment form to progress to Year 7 if continuing at Gold Creek in 2019.
