Class sizes range from 24-32 students






# Inspire and encourage a lifelong love of reading and learning - curiosity, creativity, critical and reflective citizens.

# New Contemporary Learning Environment







#### Year 7 2024 Transition Program

The Year 7 team will work closely with your child's Primary School to ensure that we know as much as possible about their academic and social/emotional needs before they begin high school, including individual plans currently in place and strategies to support your child's transition visits in our school.

Students may have additional transition visits outside of our scheduled programme at alternative arranged times if required.







#### Year 7 2024 Transition Visits Term 3 and 4

Year 6 students have the chance to attend a full day orientation at our school during Term 3.

This transition visit allows students to experience the high school setting and builds excitement around transitioning in 2024.

Students who attend a Small Group Program will have additional support through targeted meetings and transition visits to address specific needs. Families of SGP students will be contacted.







# Year 7 Transition Programme

Once High School Has Begun

Week 1:

Day 1: Year 7 students only

Day 2 onwards: Full schedule (with extra staff provided around the school and classrooms to support students)

Year 7 team building activities are also planned during Week 1 to provide students with the opportunity to develop friendships and make connections with like minded peers.







#### Chromebooks

The ACT Education Directorate provides a Chromebook to all year 7 students for school and home use for the purpose of learning. Students may also choose to BYOD.

Chromebooks are usually delivered to the school in the first week of Term 1 for distribution.

This Chromebook will travel with the students throughout their school period whilst in public education. Students receive a new Chromebook in Year 10 to carry them through to Year 12 (if they remain in public education).
