Athletics Carnival Results

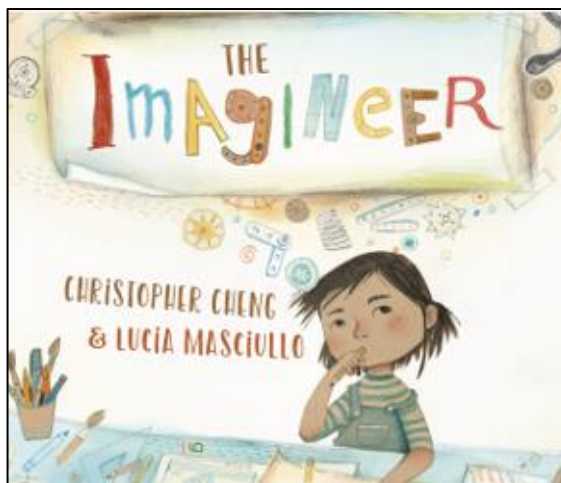

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Years 2 & 3 Aquasafe Swimming

The year 2 and 3 students have enjoyed attending the Aquasafe program at CISAC this week. The students have attended the pool daily to learn vital water safety skills. Students have shown wonderful risk-taking skills in overcoming challenges and developing their confidence in and around the water. From a range of swimming styles, to practising a range of safe ways to enter the water, getting in and out of a boat and using life jackets students have enjoyed practising and developing these skills. Students have been reflective learners, identifying their strengths and areas for development in addition to being balanced risk-takers who show care for their fellow students with different levels of water experience. Comments from our Year 3 students:

“At swimming this week, we practised how to safely get on and off an inflatable boat. We also learned about sculling and practised how to do this for a small amount of seconds and then longer and longer.”

“I loved stepping and jumping into the pool. I also really loved how we could do sinkies and go to the bottom.”

“We learnt how to do lifesaving and how to save someone who is drowning.”

“Floating on our back was fun, we learned how to float for longer and how to get in and out of the pool safely.”

“Going through hula hoops underwater and high fiving people underwater was fun. We also learned how to float with a pool noodle.”

“We practised how to be safe.”

“My favourite part of swimming was being on the boat and wearing the lifejackets.”

“I like diving and doing somersaults”.

“Jumping of the diving board was my favourite part of swimming.”

“I enjoyed swimming and picking the sinkies up from the bottom of the pool.”

“I liked learning how to put my face under the water.”

“Learning how to get into a huddle so the water in the middle got warm and it could help keep you safe in the ocean.”

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YEAR 5 NEWS

Where We Are in Place and Time

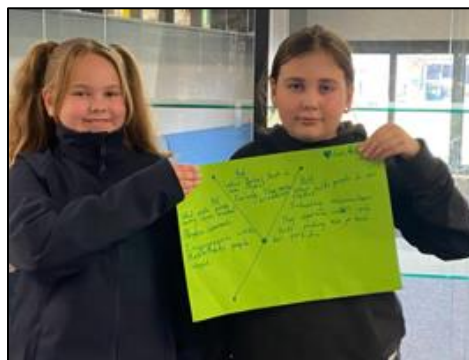
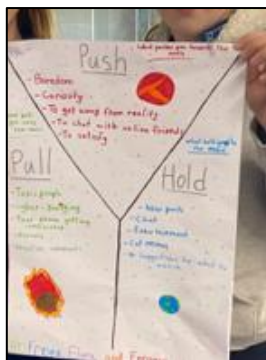
Year 5 are currently undertaking our 'Where we are in place and time' inquiry. The central idea for this unit is *The media plays a role in the choices of individuals and societies*, and our lines of inquiry are,

- Responsibility - Our ethical responsibilities when interacting with the media.
- Change - How the media has changed over time.
- Connection - How the media connects us or disconnects us.

During our UOI we looked at the history of communication and media and how both have changed over time. As part of this, to demonstrate different ways of communication, and to fit in with Naidoc Week, Year 5 learned about message sticks. Message sticks are a form of communication used by first nations people to communicate across the Australian continent for tens of thousands of years. The Year 5 students made their own message sticks to introduce themselves and express their identity. They used symbols to express their interests and some added words as well. They will be displayed on copies of the indigenous and Torres Strait Islander flags during the Gold Creek NAIDOC celebration in Week 7.



During our UOI we looked at the history of communication and media and how both have changed over time. Responsibility when interacting with the media and ways of determining whether information is factual, or opinion was a strong focus. The negative and positive aspects of media use were emphasised and each individual's responsibility, in terms of mental and physical effects, were discussed.

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APPLICATIONS ARE NOW OPEN FOR FUTURE OF EDUCATION EQUITY FUND – ROUND 2, 2022

The ACT Government's expanded Future of Education Equity Fund provides financial assistance to low-income families (and independent students) with students in years P-12 to meet the costs of education expenses, such as school uniforms, school excursions, sport equipment and activities and music lessons through a one-off payment.

The Future of Education Student Equity Fund Round 1 opened in late 2021 for families with students in years 7-10. Round 2 is only open to families who have NOT already applied for and/or received payment to support their students in the 2022 school year using a paper-based form.

The following payments are available to those who meet the eligibility criteria:

- \$400 for preschool students
- \$500 for primary school students
- \$750 for high-school and college students

2022 applications close 30 September 2022. Only applications received by this date will be processed. There is no limit on the number of students for whom each applicant can apply, providing they meet all conditions.

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must:

Reside in the ACT

Have sole or shared parental responsibility for a dependent student(s) in grades P-12; or be an independent student

Be financially responsible for the student(s)

Demonstrate low-income status through:

a current means-tested Health Care Card or Centrelink card, which must list the student(s) as dependents; or alternative forms of evidence proving low-income status or equivalent financial stress.

Students must be:

- Enrolled full-time in a public or non-government school in the ACT in years P-12.
NOTE: For the purposes of the Equity Fund, a preschool is defined as a preschool that is attached to an ACT school and led by a Principal. When applying online, only eligible preschools will appear in a drop-down list.
- Enrolled in an approved form of education other than a school and of an equivalent age to a student in years K-12 E.g., attending the Canberra Institute of Technology (CIT), or registered for home-schooling in the ACT.
- Residing with the applicant in the ACT, or in special government care that is paid for by the applicant or be independent.

2022 SCHOOL SATISFACTION AND CLIMATE SUREVEY

Each year, the Directorate surveys all parents and carers, school staff and students in Years 4 to 12 about their experience of public education. The 2022 School Satisfaction & Climate Survey will be available online from 19 August to 9 September 2022. The survey results will help us to continue to make quality informed decisions about how to improve our school. No personal identifying information will be provided to any school or college.

For each child in their family who attends an ACT public school, parents and carers will receive:

- An email about the parent survey, including a link to access the survey, and
- A letter about the student survey outlining the reasons for collection and privacy provision for the data

If you do not receive the survey invitation, please check your Junk email folder; if it is not there, contact the school and you will be provided a survey link. If you do not have an email listed with the school, please contact the school on info@goldcreek.act.edu.au or phone: 6142 1300

The Parents and Carers Survey will be available online in other languages: Arabic, Burmese, Chinese, Hindi, Korean, Urdu, Vietnamese, Punjabi, Bengali, Spanish, Telugu, French and Italian. Respondents can select their preferred language when they start the survey. A shortened paper-version of the Parents and Carers Survey is also available in the following 5 languages: Dari, Dinka, Farsi, Karen and Mon. These surveys are available at the Front Office.

For the results to reflect the opinions of our whole school community, we need as many parents and carers, staff and students as possible to complete the survey. Your feedback is important, and we hope you will take part.

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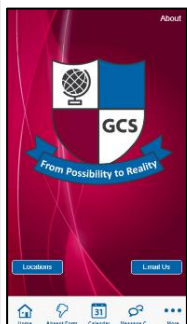
